HEATHER came to us in early August with her 4-year-old son. She came from Michigan to live with her mother in Stuart, hoping for support as a single mom. Sadly, her mom's HOA would not allow her and her son to stay. Faced with homelessness, Heather came to LAHIA for help.

Heather needed to buy time to be able to find housing that fit within her housing voucher budget.

Furthermore, with the school year approaching, Heather needed to find a VPK program for her son ASAP; doing so would also allow Heather to find work to support her family.

For the ensuing 10 days, LAHIA put Heather and her son up in a hotel, and provided administrative documentation to help her get her son into VPK. By the end of those 10 days, her son was registered with VPK. We are now blessed to report that Heather and her son have been housed, and Heather has found solid employment in the field of her choice!



IT'S A BOY! In May of 2023, LAHIA learned that one of our female clients living in the woods, was 7+ months pregnant. What followed was an amazing team effort of grace and support between numerous partner agencies.

Upon learning about the pregnancy, LAHIA quickly mobilized to support her immediate day-to-day needs, while partner agencies worked on a long-term plan for her and her baby.

LAHIA initiated daily support that included giving her full access to our air-conditioned dining room, food, water, and hygiene support, during the heat of the day, when we are normally closed to clients who aren't engaged in client services.



Meanwhile, LAHIA staff martialed key partner agencies in crafting a long-term plan. Healthy Start from the Florida Department of Health Martin County assumed prenatal care and appointments for the last two months of her pregnancy, while Ride United provided transportation to and from her appointments.

A week before the due date, LAHIA put the client up in a hotel. Both LAHIA and Healthy Start staff conducted daily wellness checks, ensuring she had sufficient food and hygiene support. Then, on the first of August, the client was transported to **Lawnwood Medical Center** in Fort Pierce, where she delivered a healthy baby boy!

Thereafter, case workers from the **Department of Children & Families**, in conjunction with **Safe Space** and **Safe Families with Children of the Treasure Coast**, found housing and support for both mother and child! How grateful we are for the life-giving support system that came together for these precious souls.
